Daniel's Matariki Feast


Daniel and his friends find 3 ripe pumpkins in the garden.


Daniel's class talk about what their families like to do at Matariki.


- Create a family tree that shows how the characters in the book are related.





- Use your imagination to draw mini pictures of the following 2 Gods:







- Include 5 new Māori words that you learnt while reading the book somewhere in your newspaper.


