


Look at the **Title**and the **pictures** to

Good Readers are able to: Ask and Answer Questions

- Read a sentence,
 paragraph or page and are
 able to ask and
 answer questions about
 what you have read
- Give evidence of the answers
- Use the title, headings, sub-headings or even words in the text to support answers

Good Readers are able to: Use Visualisation

- Draw on the five senses
 When you read you
 (see hear smell taste
 touch) through the
 pictures or words in the
 story:
- Have a mental image in your head
- Explain the mental images
 using evidence from the
 text such as words,
 phrases, punctuation,
 nouns,
 adjectives and verbs

Good Readers are able to: Predict and Re-predict

- Guess what you already know about the text and guess what might happen next?
- Predictions do not have to be correct
- Think carefully about what you are reading to see test or revise your predictions before, during and after the reading process

- Give evidence of the answers

Good Readers are able to: Use Prior Knowledge

- Make connections to what you already know or to what your are about to read
- Connect new information with what you know to help comprehend what you read
- To think about what you have learned and whether it makes sense

Good Readers are able to: Infer

- Inference uses other reading strategies as well such as prior knowledge, ask and answering of questions, visualisation, prediction, and summarising
- Uses examples, clues or words that the author has used
- Find and use links / connections between author's ideas
- Gains the deeper
 understanding of the text
