



THE ALPHABET KEY.

List all the words that relate to the topic from A to Z.

eg: Food: apple, beetroot, carrot, dessert, egg etc



THE QUESTION KEY.

Start with the answer; list 5 questions share that answer.
eg: The answer is midnight. What is the question?



THE REVERSE KEY.

Place the words CANNOT, NEVER and NOT in a sentence. Write a list.

eg: Name 10 things that you should NOT clean.



THE BRAINSTORM KEY.

State a problem, brainstorm a list of possible solutions.

eg: Place wooden seats in cars.

All children must wear a uniform to school.



THE WHAT IF KEY.

Ask a WHAT IF question. They can be silly or serious.
Can generate loads of creative ideas.

eg: WHAT IF all the cars turned into skateboards?



THE B.A.R KEY.

B: bigger. A: add. R: replace.

Use these ideas to change an everyday object.

eg: BAR a skateboard.



THE PREDICTION KEY.

Use a statement and wrote down all the things that you might think will happen.

eg: how will schools operate in 100 years time.



THE RIDICULOUS KEY.

Make a ridiculous statement that would virtually impossible to implement and try to put it into place.
eg: 6 year olds can drive cars.



THE DIFFERENT USES KEY.

List some widely different uses for a regular object.

Eg: a piece of string.



THE INTERPRETATION KEY.

Describe an situation then think of some different explanations of why it might be happening.

eg: 2 people hugging each other.
